Al and Aptitude: It's time to rethink how we measure intelligence, authored by Robert Newry (CEO, Arctic Shores)

The interest in human intelligence has been traced back to the 7th century AD, but it wasn't until the late 19th century that the modern study of intelligence began. Since Alfred Binet's early pioneering work, aptitude tests to measure intelligence have become an essential recruitment tool for many organisations. But in an era of generative AI where our most valued human capability, intelligence, is outshone by a computer programme, we need to re-evaluate what we value, and how we measure it, in terms of human intelligence.




The rapidly increasing age profile of the UK's workforce creates both strategic and psychological challenges for employers, for individuals, and for society as a whole. In this episode, Lyndsey is interviewed by Lucy Standing who, as a co-founder of Brave Starts, is herself involved in providing research-backed

insights and programmes to support late career professionals. Areas covered in the discussion include the post-war retirement construct, which is broken; evidence that the recruitment market discriminates massively against older workers, whose potential is completely underestimated; and the prevalence of attitudes and employment practices which are not conducive to sustaining careers into older life.
